VADODARA: Two Vadodara boys won first prize in the state final round of Marris International Spelling Bee 2013 14 held recently at D R Amin Memorial School in Vadodara. Around 250 participants from Ahmedabad, Vadodara, Surat and Anand, who had qualified from the earlier rounds, took part in the competition. The participants competed in their individual age groups and appeared for rounds like Spell-it, Synonyms-Antonyms and Word Origin.

Rishabh Chawda of Nalanda International School and Dhyey Shah of Baroda High School ONGC secured 1st ranks in their respective age groups. Rishabh Chawda breezed through the synonyms-antonyms round in which the meanings and opposites of the words were to be given. It was a slide show with time limit and the answers were to be given only in 15 seconds.

In spell-it round which is an oral dictation round, some words were tough and some words like Loquacious, Conceit, Contravene were tricky. Dhyey Shah also answered tough and tricky words like Sovereign, Audible, Referee. .
